The patient arrived by 999 ambulance called by the patients GP with a presenting complaint of "Falls". On arrival the patient was triaged and a full set of observations were performed and investigative bloods requested. The patient was seen by A&E Doctor and further investigations including ECG was done. The patient required monitoring and assessment by A&E Doctor, Social Team and the Trusts rapid assessment and therapy service (RAPT's) The patient was transferred to a hospital bed for comfort and later admitted to the Clinical Decision Unit (CDU) for further monitoring, review by A&E Doctor, and decision to admit or discharge made.
