

# Cryocautery to the Cervix

You can expect a watery discharge with perhaps some slight bleeding for two to three weeks.

You may experience cramp-like pains.

These can be overcome by the use of painkillers (eg Paracetamol).

Intercourse should not take place until FOUR weeks after treatment.

Do not use tampons until after your next period; this will allow time for the cervix to heal.
