Haemophilia A and B are congenital X-linked bleeding disorders resulting from deficiencies in clotting factors VIII (haemophilia A) and IX (haemophilia B). Patients with severe deficiency, defined as having less than 1% of normal plasma factor activivity, often have spontaneous bleeding within the first few years of life.

#### Linear IgA Bullous Dermatosis of Childhood

A 2-year-old boy presented with a 1-week history of itchy, red spots. Tense vesicles, erosions, and inflammatory plaques were seen. Direct immunofluorescence revealed a linear band of IgA at the dermoepidermal junction.
