

Joining the Library

How to Appraise a Paper - Critical appraisal of quantitative research

This three hour course contains presentations, discussions and a practical workshop, plus pre-course reading and a post-course resource list with web links.

The course will help you:

- Clarify where critical appraisal fits into evidence based practice
- Understand the major features of quantitative research and the
- key terminology, including interpreting forest plots
- Confidently use a CASP checklist to critically appraise journal articles


