Nicotine Replacement Therapies – see current BNF (see guidance for products stocked in Doncaster and Bassetlaw Hospitals) Buproprion 150mg Tablets Vareniciline 500microgram and 1mg Tablets

Alcohol Dependence: Chlordiazepoxide 5mg and 10mg Capsules Thiamine 50mg and 100mg Tablets Pabrinex IV Injection Pabrinex IM Injection

Opioid Dependence: Buprenorphine 400microgram, 2mg and 8mg Sublingual Tablets Lofexidine 200microgram Tablets Methadone 1mg in 1ml Oral Solution

Smoking Cessation

For guidance on prescribing smoking cessation products within Doncaster and Bassetlaw Hospitals, see <u>DBH Smoking Cessation Guidance</u>. Within Doncaster and Bassetlaw Hospitals, only those products mentioned in this guidance are routinely stocked

NICE guidance is available for evidence-based stop smoking interventions.

Remember that patients who are stopping smoking in secondary care should also be referred to a treatment agency in primary care, in order that care can be continued once they leave hospital:

Updated prescribing guidance for varenicline has recently been issued by the MHRA (further information can be found via <u>MHRA Website</u>):

- Smoking cessation, with or without pharmacotherapy, may be associated with an exacerbation of underlying psychiatric illness, including depression. Care should be taken in such patients, who should be advised of this risk
- Patients should be made aware of the possibility that trying to stop smoking might cause symptoms of depression
- Patients who are taking varenicline who develop suicidal thoughts should stop their treatment and contact their doctor immediately
