### Objectives

- At the start of each rotation you should meet with your tutor/s and agree a learning plan/develop individual objectives
- The objectives for each rotation should also be to cover all relevant National (e.g. NICE) and local policies for that area in order to understand the basic management of common conditions seen
- All areas will cover how to interpret in patient medication prescriptions and review for appropriateness
- Medicines Reconciliation
  - Follow Trust policy for undertaking medicines reconciliation / clinical coherence check
  - Provide information to the pharmacist and under supervision, to doctors
- MSK & Frailty CG (Musculoskeletal & Frailty Care Group)
  - This includes orthopaedic, care of the older person and rehabilitation wards

- Medicines Reconciliation with medicines management technicians and pharmacists
- Clinical topics / objectives to cover
  - Thromboprophylaxis in orthopaedic vs medical/surgical patients
  - Post-Operative Nausea and Vomiting
  - Orthopaedic Enhanced Recovery Protocol (Analgesia)
  - Antibiotic Prophylaxis
  - Falls & medication review
  - Patients with swallowing difficulties
  - Compliance aids pros and cons
  - Understanding of polypharmacy & hyperpolypharmacy and deprescribing
- Emergency Care Group
  - This includes medical and surgical admissions wards, respiratory, gastroenterology wards
  - Medicines Reconciliation with medicines management technicians and pharmacists
  - Clinical Topics / objectives to cover
    - Thromboprophylaxis
    - COPD / Asthma Exacerbations
    - Gastroenterology (e.g.chronic liver disease, UC, Crohn's disease)
- Speciality Care Group
  - This includes CCU, Acute stroke, Haematology in-patients, renal & rheumatology ward, endocrinology ward, vascular and urology surgical wards
  - Medicines Reconciliation with medicines management technicians and pharmacists
  - Clinical Topics / objectives to cover
    - Acute management of ischaemic stroke
    - Acute and chronic kidney disease
    - Thromboprophylaxis
    - Post-Operative Nausea and Vomiting
    - DKA, hypoglycaemia protocols
    - Patients with swallowing difficulties
  - Counselling points on discharge for patients who have had an MI or a CVA
  - Common SE and CI for medications in cardiology, renal and stroke patients
- Surgical Care Group
  - Gastroenterology surgical wards, ENT ward, DCC
  - Medicines Reconciliation with medicines management technicians and pharmacists
  - Clinical Topics / objectives to cover
    - Thromboprophylaxis

- Post-Operative Nausea and Vomiting
  - DCC policies
  - Analgesia
  - Pharmaceutical management of the pre and post-operative patient (e.g. fasting, swallowing, ileus)
  - TPN
- Medicines Information (MI)
  - Complete UKMI pre-registration trainee workbook
  - Assist answering MI queries providing answers in a variety of ways e.g. via phone, letter or email
- Dispensary
  - Familiarise self with dispensary procedures
  - Become familiar with types of prescription used at DRI
  - Learn usual doses for medication
  - Understand stock ordering processes
  - Undertake dispensing and checking training packages and validations
- Aseptic services
  - Complete training booklet provided
  - Watch presentation sent by specialist pharmacist
  - Attend clinic with specialist pharmacist
  - Watch nurses administer chemotherapy and speak with patient
- Paediatrics
  - Accompany Consultant paediatric pharmacist to NNU and paediatric wards
  - Undertake questions in booklet
  - Familiarise self with paediatric policies
  - Familiarise self with paediatric TPN
- Clinical
  - own ward with small group of patients that you will care for under supervision of tutor / pharmacist
  - order non – stock medication
  - review patients and medication in a structured way
  - check patients blood results when appropriate and relate to condition and medication
  - develop care plans for patients and suggest solutions to problems identified
  - discuss any interventions with supervising pharmacist
  - assist supervising pharmacist and discharge technicians in supply and counselling patients on discharge
- Cross Sector Experience
  - Community exact dates to be confirmed each year
  - 1-2 weeks dependent upon student need
  - Usually during the months of March – April.
  - Undertaken with community pharmacies in Doncaster area
- Audit
  - \*Provisional audit dates

- Audit to be submitted to hospital and regional training providers for assessment
- Regional Training
  - Plus regional study days as organised.
  - Provided by University of Leeds
  - First Aid per regional organisation (**C2.10**)
