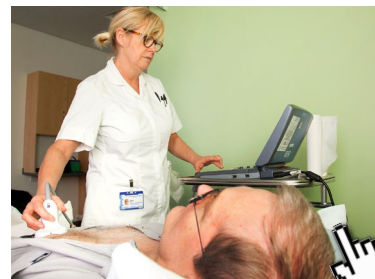


AAA team hop aboard the health bus in Wath
