satisfied that the injury is not serious. However, your child may be more tired than normal. Your child has sustained a head injury and following a thorough examination we are

Allow him/her to sleep but check regularly that you can wake him/her.

Give Calpol or Disprol (paediatric paracetamol) for any pain or headache.

48 hours after the injury. Any child who has had a head injury should be watched carefully, especially in the first

If your child should develop any of the following:

- Does not wake up when called or gently shaken.
- Headaches not relieved by Calpol or Disprol (paediatric paracetamol).
- Repeated vomiting.
- Weakness in an arm or a leg
- Irritability (crying without obvious reason, not interested in his/her normal toys).
- Fits or convulsions.
