

How to look after your wound following a hip or knee replacement

When you have been discharged from hospital **do not** remove your own dressing or touch your wound as you could accidentally transfer germs from your fingers to your wound.

If you have any of the following symptoms:

- Increased swelling
- Increased redness
- Increased pain
- Discharge of fluid or pus from wound.

Contact: the Modular Ward at Doncaster Royal Infirmary.

Speak to a nurse who will then advise you to either come to the ward to see a doctor or an appointment will be made for you to return to clinic to see the consultant. **Do not** see your GP with any of the above problems or the district nurse.

Clips will be removed after 14 to 21 days following surgery. The dressing should not be changed during this time therefore you will not be discharged with any dressings.
