We don't use SHARE,

We use the capacity act, and have annual updates on this for vulnerable people and safeguarding training for adults and children, training annually .These are mandatory.

We use clinical record keeping for confidentiality, and sharing of information, this is also mandatory training. The question about NHS trust sharing information with other parties, I don't have any information about the number of patients we do this for.

We liaise regularly with police, ambulance staff, social services when discussing risk.
