Request for Information under the Freedom of Information Act2000

Dear Doncaster and Bassetlaw Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust,

Please could you provide me the following information: 1. What contractual relationships are in place for supplying agency nurses and who is responsible for managing them?

Agency nursing staff are booked via Framework Agencies who have NHS Cap compliant rate cards set up with DBTH. Bookings are via NHS Professionals cascade, once the internal executive level agency process has approved the shift being released to agency.

2. How many agencies are used to supply agency nurses? 11

3. Of these agencies, how many are off framework – please list them?

1 – Greys Specialist Recruitment was in use during the period requested. However no longer in use as all vacancies in that specialist area now recruited to.

4. Since July 2024 (last 3 months), how many shifts have been filled via an off framework agency?

67 – All specialist Occupational Health nursing requirements.

5. Who is your highest paid agency nurse, what is their speciality and their hourly charge?

In general highest agency rates were apportioned to Occupational Health demand, which has now ended therefore no detail to share. Trust wide, all nursing rates are cap compliant or below cap at Band 5, with the exception of Neonatal services where Band 6 below cap rates are in place for Specialist Qualification nurses only. Exempt information under section 40(2) (personal information) of the FOIA

Names, job titles (other than those on our Staff Structure Chart), email addresses and the ethnic background of employees constitutes personal data, as defined under the Data Protection Act 2018 (DPA 2018). Disclosing this information could potentially lead to the identification of individuals, and thus infringe upon their privacy rights. The disclosure of personal data is exempt under the following grounds:

Exemption 40 (2) - Personal Data

1. Personal Information: The information you have requested relates to identifiable individuals. According to DPA 2018, the processing of personal data must comply with principles of lawfulness, fairness, and transparency.

2. Unwarranted Invasion of Privacy: Disclosure of this data could result in an unwarranted invasion of privacy of the individuals concerned.

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3. Data Protection Principles: Sharing such information without the consent of the individuals involved would breach the data protection principles that are intended to safeguard personal privacy.

Section 40(2) provides that personal data is exempt information if one of the conditions set out in section 40(3) is satisfied. In our view, disclosure of this information would breach the data protection principles contained in the General Data Protection Regulations and Data Protection Act 2018

In reaching this decision, we have particularly considered:

- the reasonable expectations of the employees given their positions;
- these individuals are not in public facing roles and have an expectation that their names and direct contact details will not be put into the public domain. It would be unfair for us to disclose their details and would contravene the first data protection principle.
- the consequences of disclosure; and
- any legitimate public interest in disclosure.

Section 40(2) is an absolute exemption and therefore not subject to the public interest test.
