We regret to inform you that we are unable to provide the requested information. From the data available to us through the Camis system, there is no means of identifying whether a patient was admitted to a Level 2 or Level 3 bed. As a result, we cannot determine whether any of the adults with a learning disability admitted to the acute hospital during this period were placed in these specific beds.

Please note that while we cannot provide data at a bed level, we have been able to answer questions 10 and 11, which request variations at a ward-based level rather than a bed-based level.
