Freedom of Information Act Request

Under the Freedom of Information Act, I would like to request the following information:

I would be grateful if you could help me with this data.

From your hospital surgical database, please can you provide us with:

1. the number of Colposuspensions conducted in your unit between January 2020 and January 2025.

Of these, please clarify how many were conducted: -open - 68 -laparoscopically - * -robotically - 0

How many of these cases have needed to go back to theatre for any procedure under the care of urogynaecology/gynaecology/urology since the initial operation?
Please state, what procedures they then underwent.
Numbers supressed as less than 5

After careful consideration, we are unable to provide specific numerical data where the count is fewer than five. This decision is made to protect the privacy of individuals and is consistent with our obligations under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) and the Data Protection Act 2018.

Explanation of Exemption:

Section 40(2) of the FOIA exempts the release of personal data if it would contravene any of the data protection principles set out in the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR) and the Data Protection Act 2018.

The numbers requested pertain to very small groups, which could potentially lead to the identification of individuals, thereby constituting personal data.

Disclosing this information would breach the first data protection principle, which requires that personal data is processed lawfully, fairly, and in a transparent manner. Releasing data where the numbers are fewer than five could inadvertently disclose personal information about identifiable individuals.

Public Interest Test:

Section 40(2) is an absolute exemption and does not require a public interest test. The need to protect personal data and the privacy of individuals outweighs the interest in disclosure in these cases.
