

## **Freedom of Information Act Request**

Under the Freedom of Information Act, I would like to request the following information:

I would like to submit an FOI request relating to information about patients presenting to Emergency Departments, or Accident and Emergency. The request is as follows:

I request that any data held for presentations to your Trust Emergency Department(s) where the reason for presentation has been due to a chainsaw-related incident. Please could you share data for the last 10 years for all presentations that are associated with use of a chainsaw.

I understand there are sensitivities in when relating to patients, so if you are able to provide the data as a whole number that doesn't identify any patient, that would be great.

Following a search of our records, we can confirm that Doncaster and Bassetlaw Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust does not hold this information in a readily reportable or searchable format.

The Trust's Emergency Department systems do not contain a dedicated, coded field to specifically record "chainsaw-related" injuries. While such information may exist within free-text clinical notes, it is not structured in a way that allows automated reporting based on keywords such as "chainsaw."

To identify these cases, the Trust would need to manually review a large volume of patient records over a 10-year period to locate any references to chainsaw use. This would involve examining free-text notes and triage information for thousands of attendances, which would significantly exceed the cost and time limits defined in Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

### **Section 12 – Exceeds Appropriate Cost Limit**

Section 12 of the Act states that a public authority is not obliged to comply with a request if the estimated cost of determining whether the information is held, locating, retrieving, and extracting it would exceed the appropriate limit of 18 hours of staff time, equivalent to £450.

Given the volume of Emergency Department attendances and the absence of searchable fields for chainsaw-related incidents, we estimate that complying with this request would exceed this threshold.

We are therefore unable to provide the requested data, as the information is not held in a reportable format, and extracting it would exceed the statutory cost limit under Section 12 of the FOI Act.
