## Section 42 – Legal Professional Privilege

This exemption applies to information that consists of confidential communications between a professional legal adviser and their client made for the purpose of giving or receiving legal advice, or in contemplation of litigation. The reasons for engaging these legal firms relate to legal advice and proceedings, and disclosure would breach legal professional privilege.

## Section 40(2) – Personal Information

This exemption applies because some information could identify individuals involved in legal proceedings, inquests, or sensitive matters. Disclosure of such information would contravene the data protection principles under the UK GDPR and Data Protection Act 2018, specifically regarding the fair and lawful processing of personal data.

Public Interest Test (Section 42)

Section 42 is a qualified exemption and requires consideration of the public interest. The Trust recognises the general public interest in openness and transparency. However, there is a stronger public interest in maintaining the confidentiality of legal communications to ensure organisations can receive full and frank legal advice and to protect the integrity of legal proceedings.

On balance, the Trust considers that the public interest in withholding this information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

Therefore, while we have disclosed the names of the legal firms and the timeframes of engagement, we have withheld the specific descriptions of the work under Section 42 and Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

If you are not satisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to request an internal review.
