

Freedom of Information Act Request

I am writing to request information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Q1. How many patients were treated in total, regardless of diagnosis or regimen, with the following medicines in the 3 months between the start of October 2025 and end of December 2025, or latest 3-month period available?

Name of medicine	Number patients treated
1.1 Daratumumab	56
1.2 Lenalidomide	93

Q2. How many patients with **Multiple Myeloma** were treated with the following medicines in combination, in the 3 months between the start of October 2025 and end of December 2025, or latest 3-month period available?

2.2 Daratumumab + Bortezomib + Thalidomide + Dexamethasone [DVTd]	10

2.8 Belantamab mafodotin (monotherapy)	0
2.9 Belantamab mafodotin + Bortezomib + Dexamethasone [BVd]	#
2.10 Belantamab mafodotin + Pomalidomide + Dexamethasone [BPd]	0
2.11 Isatuximab + Bortezomib + Lenalidomide + Dexamethasone [IsaVRd]	#
2.12 Isatuximab + Pomalidomide + Dexamethasone [IsaPd]	6

Where figures are fewer than five, they have been replaced with “#”.

This is because the disclosure of very small numbers, particularly when combined with other information provided (such as year, service area or site), may risk the identification of individuals. The Trust has therefore applied small number suppression in accordance with **Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (Personal Data)**.

Section 40(2) exempts information from disclosure where it constitutes personal data and where disclosure would be unfair or unlawful under the UK General Data Protection Regulation and the Data Protection Act 2018.
